The future looks bright for new bairns

NEW parents receiving Scotland's Baby Box will be among the first to benefit from a doubling of free early learning and childcare in Scotland.

The Baby Box initiative which rolled out in August, is inspired by Finnish baby boxes, and gives all newborns and their parents a box of essential items to help them through their first six months.

The box can also be used for babies to sleep in.

First Minister Nicola Sturgeon promoted the initiative during a visit to a nursery in Glasgow, where she met babies who will be among the first to benefit from the commitment to double funded childcare provision by the end of this Parliament.

Speaking after the visit at Butterfly Nursery in Arden, Glasgow, the First Minister said: "Scotland's Baby Box is giving children the best possible start in life, and we are committed to doing all we can to make sure Scotland is the best place for a child to grow up.

"Our commitment to almost doubling entitlement to free early learning and childcare hours will benefit the Baby Box generation and ensure they can grow and develop in the very best environments, like the one I visited today. It will also benefit families by allowing parents to go back to work or further study.

"The importance of early

years development simply cannot be overstated, which is why my government is putting so much emphasis on doing all we can to improve the life chances of youngsters across Scotland."

The Baby Box generation will also benefit from a new Early Years' Grant for low income families, delivering £300 birth payments for all children and additional payments of £250 at key transition points in the early vears: access to affordable and nutritious food through the Healthy Start Voucher scheme for low income families: the expanded Family Nurse Partnership programme; and 500 more health visitors by the end of next year.

The healing power of tea

SUNDAY tea parties are proving an effect way of combatting loneliness among the elderly as a charity is encouraging people to host and attend a meet up over tea and conversation.

Contact the Elderly is supported by a network of volunteers, who organise monthly Sunday afternoon tea parties for small groups of older people aged 75 and over who live alone, offering a regular and vital friendship link every month.

Sunday afternoon is highlighted as a particularly lonely day of the week for older people living alone and the charity is seeking to remedy this and transform lives over tea, chat and friendship.

Keeping its groups small, with the same individuals meeting every month, it encourages guests and volunteers to make lasting and fulfilling friendships in the personal and welcoming environment of someone's home.

If you know someone aged 75 and over who lives alone, has little contact with friends or family and finds it difficult getting out and about, a change of scenery and regular meet ups may be just what they need.

Each older person is collected from their home by a volunteer driver and taken to a volunteer host's home for the afternoon. The group is warmly welcomed by a different host each month, but the drivers remain the same which means that over the months and years, acquaintances turn into friends and loneliness is replaced by companionship.

The tea parties are a real lifeline of friendship for older guests who have

little or no contact with family or friends. They bring people of all ages together, develop fulfilling friendships and support networks, and give everyone involved something to look forward to each month.

The results are in

PUPILS across East Dunbartonshire have proved they're some bright sparks after strong exam results were published by the SQA.

The results for the area's eight secondary schools remain strong across all year groups with bigger numbers of S6 pupils achieving Advanced Highers and more S5 pupils achieving 3+ and 5+ Higher passes.

Across the area, 94.7 per cent of S4 pupils achieved five or more National 4 passes while 66.8 per cent obtained five or more passes at National 5.

Amongst 5th year pupils, 77.9 per cent obtained one or more Highers while 60.7 per cent achieved three or more Highers. The number of S5 pupils achieving five or more Highers rose by 1.2 per cent.

The number of S6 pupils achieving Advanced

Highers rose by almost 2 per cent to 35.8 per cent with 33.1 per cent gaining three or more Highers.

Councillor Mohrag Fischer, Convener of the Education Committee, said, "It is clear from these results that pupils, supported by conscientious and committed staff, have worked very hard over the last academic year to return some very strong exam results.

"I'd like to congratulate all those young people who achieved what they set out to do and are now embarking on the next stage of their lives whether that be in school, further education, training or in the workplace.

"My thanks go to the teachers and staff within our schools who work tirelessly with young people to identify and build on their strengths and ensure high levels of attainment and achievement in all our schools."

Flu vaccine

PRIMARY School pupils throughout East Dunbartonshire are set to receive the flu vaccine this October.

A team of 29 school immunisation staff from NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde (NHSGGC) will visit 34 primary schools in the area, reaching almost 9,000 children.

The flu vaccine is given as a painless nasal spray. Children who can't have the nasal spray for medical or religious reasons can receive the vaccine as an injection in the upper arm.

Children have the highest flu attack rates and are more likely to pass on the virus to family, friends and the wider community.

However, evidence from Public Health England has shown that where primary school age children were given the vaccine there is a significant reduction in the

number of children and adults attending GPs and hospitals with flu like illness.


Emilia Crighton, deputy director of Public Health, NHSGGC, said: "It may seem very early to be thinking about flu during the summer holidays, however we want to immunise as many children – one of the most vulnerable groups - as possible.

"Vaccinating 85,000 primary children over a nine week period is a massive operation for our teams. However, it is hugely important as the vaccine is the best protection we have against an unpredictable virus which causes severe illness and deaths each year.

"If a primary pupil was immunised against flu last year it is important they get the vaccine again this year, as the virus changes every year. As a result, a different vaccine has to be made every year, meaning annual vaccination is necessary for children.

"I'd urge parents and carers to return the completed permission form as soon as possible. Flu needs to be taken seriously – it's not the same as the common cold and the virus can have an immediate and severe effect."





Read all about it

YOUNG bookworms are invited on a world of discovery at their local library.

East Dunbartonshire Libraries invite parents and young children to Bookbug sessions, which take place on various dates throughout the year.

Open to youngsters aged between 0-four, Bookbug sessions are fun, free and friendly events for little ones and their families to enjoy together.

During the 30 minute sessions children and grown-ups share stories, songs and rhymes and have fun at the same time.

Studies have revealed that just a few minutes of reading or singing every day can help develop language skills, boost confidence, help relaxation and offer quality time. Each Bookbug session offers the opportunity for children to play and learn whilst interacting with others.

Can you spare a pint?

AN upcoming blood donation session hopes to encourage locals to do their part to help save a life.

On Monday 20 November the Scottish Blood Transfusion Service (SNBTS) is calling on locals to join them at Killermont Parish Church in Bearsden from 2-3.45pm and again at 5.15-7.15pm.

The process of giving blood is quick and simple.

After filling in a donor health check questionnaire and having a check-up from a nurse, a donor's haemoglobin (iron) level will be tested to ensure they can spare a pint of blood.

Once everything is checked and in order, they will then make their donation.

Each donation takes around 10 to

15 minutes and staff aim to take around 470mls of blood - with additional samples for testing.

Every day Scottish patients receive life-enhancing or life-saving treatments using the blood donated.

Within 24 hours of a donation, blood is processed, tested and available for use and one blood donation can save or improve the lives of up to three people.


Unlock the local area's potential

Top tips to avoid your grass, plants and flowers having the post-holiday blues

Returned from holiday to find bedraggled plants, an overgrown lawn, herbs and flowers which have run to seed and a glut of crops you couldn't give away?

So, what do you do? Firstly, don't despair

The rain we've had this summer may have gone some way to saving flower borders, but containers left in sheltered spots may have dried out without the luxury of

an automatic irrigation system, or a friendly neighbour to water them in your absence. Guv Barter. RHS chief horticultural adviser. reckons that if your bedding plants haven't dried out completely, you should have a month of good growing weather left in the south of the country and a little less in the north "The recent

wet weather will have helped gardens enormously, but containers are still likely to be fairly dry, so you need to give them a really good soak, deadhead the flowers and give plants a good feed," he advises.

Cut back and feed container plants

Container plants, including petunias, can be cut back and should produce another burst of growth, provided the slugs haven't devoured the base of the plants during the rainy period, he says.

You should also be able to give trailing plants such as lobelia and bacopa a haircut and a feed, to prompt them into further flowering. Watch out for slugs





"People who have been away during the wet weather should be prepared to come back to find a lot of slug damage," he adds. "They will eat petunias around the base and feast on hosta leaves, and the plants will not produce more leaves this year."

It may be wise to feed vulnerable plants with nematodes, biological controls which are specifically designed to attack slugs and vine weevil.

Be aware that many

biological controls become less reliable when the temperature drops, as the predatory insects which provide the control then multiply more slowly. Check for greenfly and blackfly and take off shoots on plants which are infested and dispose of them. **Grab plant bargains**

"You can also get some plant

bargains at garden centres at this time of year, including herbaceous perennials such as delphiniums and lupins, which have finished flowering, but should grow strongly next year and hopefully be free of mildew."

Tackle overgrown lawns

You may be returning to long grass, which will have been growing thanks to the mixed weather we've had in summer. When tackling it, Guy recommends not taking off more than a third at a time until it has recovered and don't feed the lawn until autumn.

As for vegetables, you should be returning home to bumper crops, although tomato blight tends to appear in warm, wet weather and if your plants succumb, there's not a lot you can do apart from consign them to the bonfire. **Giant veg may have to be**

ditched

"You may have enormous marrows when you actually wanted courgettes and rather tough, stringy beans which

have been left too long for picking. But some of the overgrown veg could go into chutneys."

Lettuces may have bolted or been damaged by slugs and if they are, lift them and replace them with other crops such as Chinese leaves and spinach, while mustard seeds can also be sown for green manure. Spring onions can also be sown now, where they are to mature and left to overwinter until they are ready for harvesting in spring.
