














Switch-on to digital learning



Guests of all ages can expect an afternoon of fun at the West of Scotland


Rugby Club in Milngavie with the event set to kick off at 1pm.



On yer bike!

IT'S ready, set, go for the The European Cycling Challenge (ECC) this May.

Residents from across Bearsden and Milngavie and being urged to get on their bikes between May 1 and 31 as part of the initiative which encourages people to embrace a little pedal power - whether it's for leisure, pleasure or a commute.

Glasgow City took part last year and - when the combined miles cycled were added up - finished a respectable 18th in Europe (out of 52).

This year the aim is to get even more people involved, with the Glasgow team widened to include East Dunbartonshire, West Dunbartonshire, North Lanarkshire and Renfrewshire.

Participants track their bike trips with a free app - contributing to the overall mileage - and can check their team position in real-time via online leaderboards.

The ECC also provides valuable data - creating 'heat maps' which show popular routes, cyclist activities, areas of potential congestion and more.

NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde has joined forces with East Dunbartonshire Council and other local authorities in the west of Scotland to promote the initiative.

Thomas Glen, East Dunbartonshire's depute chief executive - Place. Neighbourhood &

Corporate Assets, said: "Whether you are cycling all the way to work, to the station, going to the shops or just enjoying being out and about on your bike, we want you to take part and record vour routes.

"The combined miles cycled between 1 and 31 May by people in and around East Dunbartonshire will be calculated and will go towards Glasgow City Region's final standing.

"Please get involved. It all adds up - not just for the challenge, but also in terms of fitness and wellbeing.

"It will also help to provide detailed feedback about cyclists' needs and the challenges being faced by people who wish to travel more actively.

"In addition, there are more than 120 prizes for best cyclists and prize draws throughout just for taking part and getting out on your bike.

"Promotion of cycling and walking is a priority for this Council, which is forging ahead with its Active Travel Strategy."

All cycling is permitted as part of the ECC with the exception of sporting and training events.

Potter fans disappointed after festival is cancelled



HARRY Potter fans were left feeling anything but magical as a popular festival set to take place in Bearsden was cancelled.

Organisers of the three-day wizarding extravaganza – which had been scheduled to take place from June 23 to 25 – said they had been 'blown away' by the enthusiasm from the festival but have had to call it off due to a variety of different issues.

In a statement they said: "We want to make it work but now we need much more time to do so.

"Because it has grown so big, we have to sort out safety, parking, capacity and licensing implications and we will not have enough time to do that for this year but want to work on that for some time in the future.

"We hope you understand and we know many will be disappointed, but after conversations with the police and our local council - who have both been incredibly helpful and supportive - we believe this is the right course of action for us - but watch this space for the future."

To celebrate 20 years since J. K. Rowling's 'The Philosopher's Stone' was first published, locals had come together to turn the town into a spellbinding festival.

Butterbeer and Potter burgers were to be made available at a great Forbidden Forest BBQ, and there was also to be a special Room of Requirement at Café Crème in New Kirk Road.

Fantastic beasts would have been making an appearance and a Quidditch tournament and Harry Potter service was also set to take place with many other events lined up around the town.


Our sister title The

Evening Times reported ahead of the event and readers quickly showed enthusiasm for it: within hours, our Facebook post received almost 10,000 reactions, comments, and shares.

As fans from across the country and Europe became spellbound, organisers reminded them on Tuesday that it's a "local event" and not "something like T in the Park."

"We never imagined - foolishly perhaps - that people would be prepared to travel from down south and across from Ireland and even from the Netherlands for a Harry Potter festival," said organisers.

"We are absolutely going to be running a Harry Potter festival but we don't want people to be disappointed in what they find," they added before cancelling.
