Bearsden and Milngavie residents, along with commuters and visitors, are being encouraged to explore the area after a new map was launched to guide people to local gems.

A new Walking and Cycling Map has been printed by the Council, which includes a fold-out map with 17 local routes of varving distances across East Dunbartonshire - most of them family friendly and using the off-road network. It also includes safety checks before you set out, information on cycle parking and local walking groups, Scottish Outdoor Access Code. and contact details for the Council and other organisations (including public transport providers).

Key buildings and places to visit are also highlighted – including Roman remains, Lenzie Moss, the Auld Wives' Lifts and

Mugdock Country Park. The aim is to encourage people to get active, whether for work or pleasure. The map also makes it easier to plan everyday journeys – whether you're travelling to work, shops, leisure centres, Community Hubs, libraries, cultural venues or accessing local facilities.

Copies of the map are available from Community Hubs, libraries, cycle shops, community centres and leisure centres, as well as Kirkintilloch Town Hall, Kilmardinny House, Auld Kirk Museum, Lillie Art Gallery, Twechar Healthy Living & Enterprise Centre, and Council offices at Southbank Marina and Broomhill.

The six are Mari MacGregor, S4 (cello), Raj Bhaumik, S4 (clarinet/principal bass clarinet), Libby Hunter (pictured), S4 (French horn), Erin Black, S6



(piano), Louisa Buchan, S6 (clarinet) and Chun Yi Kang, S4 (violin).

Raj Bhaumik and Chun Yi Kang have also progressed to the second round of the BBC Young Musician of The Year Competition, which this year will be held in Cardiff.

The Grand Final will be held

in May 2020 at the Bridgewater Hall, Manchester, where finalists will have the opportunity to perform a concerto of their choice with the BBC Philharmonic.

Libby Hunter, 15, who had to perform at two auditions, is one of only 10 French horn players in the UK to be chosen.

She said: "I'm really chuffed. I wasn't expecting it and went to the audition for the learning experience.

"I was surprised when I got a second audition. I would never have dreamt of being in this orchestra.

"Going to the music school has really helped."



Boost for local childcare

Bearsden is one of three new sites in the area set to welcome a new Early Years Centre in August 2020. The programme reached a major landmark recently after as the first sods were officially cut and their names revealed.

The centres are being built as part of the Council's commitment to deliver on the Scottish Government's requirement for additional hours of early learning and childcare.

From August, all three and four-year-olds, as well as eligible two-year-olds, will receive 1140 hours,



almost doubling the original allocation of 600 hours. Construction is underway and when complete, the buildings will provide 275 places for local families. The Bearsden Early Years Centre will be built on the site of the former Brookwood Library in Drymen Road, Bearsden, it will offer 87 places and be associated with Bearsden Primary School.

The Oakburn Early Years Centre will be built on the former St Joseph's Primary School site in Craigdhu Road, Milngavie, it will offer 94 places and be a stand-alone facility.

There will also be the Lairdsland Early Years Centre in Kirkintilloch.

Joint Leader of East Dunbartonshire Council, Vaughan Moody said: "At an exciting time for early years it is good to see these centres progressing with building work underway and names being agreed. We are committed to delivering additional hours by next August giving families with young children a childcare boost."

Heritage routes link community

A recent project set about uniting local history, culture and communities by inviting residents to take a stroll down memory lane.

Artists and residents teamed up to create a range of artworks on heritage trails throughout the north of the city.

Free guided walks took place in a number of areas, including Milngavie and Bishopbriggs.

The scheme was part of East Dunbartonshire Leisure and Culture (EDLC) Trust's Trails and Tales programme, which encourages locals to explore the history of their area through outdoor arts and heritage routes.

One of the artists involved, Macedonian-born Elpida

Hadzi-Vasileva, explained: "My work is a response to the site of Kilmardinny and its history and link with Calico printing. It took me into EDLC's archives to look at patterns and samples, and allowed me to work with some amazing local volunteers and Trails and Tales supporters, training them in the





craft of gold leaf gilding in the making of the work."

She adds: "Being directed to the heritage of the area through the research and consultation work that had already been undertaken by the Trails and Tales team was a huge help. It meant artists already had stories and ideas they could respond to."

Visual artist Toby Paterson, designer Simon Whatley and gardener Dug Macleod worked together for one of the projects.

Toby said: "The way the trails have been developed and then punctuated by these artworks is a really interesting approach to a large-scale commissioning of public works."



A greener outlook for station

Milngavie station has been lovingly brought to life thanks to one green-fingered apprentice.

A welcome display of trees and shrubs now greets anyone passing through the local station thanks to the handy work of one of East Dunbartonshire Council's apprentices.

Christopher Donnelly started as a Modern Apprentice in August 2018 and has been working the Council's Streetscene Environmental team. At the start of the summer he was tasked with making improvements to the planted area around the railway station.

In addition to planting new shrubs, Christopher cleared the wooded area of debris and put fresh soil down which was sown with woodland wild flower mix. Bins were replaced with



larger capacity ones and the area was cleaned and tidied with bark chips put down in the planted areas. Dead vegetation was removed from a long raised bed and replaced with a membrane topped with grey granite chips and three decorative acer trees.

Christopher started his apprenticeship with EDC at Langfaulds Cemetery in Bearsden and attends Daldowie Training Centre two days a week. Now into the second year of his apprenticeship Christopher, 17, said, "I applied for this apprenticeship when still at school as I felt strongly that I wanted to get out and work in a job like this.

as it is where tourists start their journey on the famous West Highland Way. I have really enjoyed doing this and watching the plants bloom and develop."



How to winter-proof your home

The long winter evenings are well and truly here, along with wind, wet, and possibly snow, so it's time to make sure your home is well prepared for wintry weather...

1. Draught-proof doors and windows

For windows that open, use self-adhesive strips to seal up any gaps around the frame, and use a soft, silicone sealant for windows that stay closed. Doors can be given similar treatment, but for floor level openings, it may be simpler to employ an old-fashioned, 'sausage dog' draught excluder.

2. Install foil behind your radiators

If you have radiators fixed to external walls, slide a layer of tin foil between wall and unit to reflect as much heat as possible back into the room. Pick up special heat reflector aluminium foil to maximise retention, and remember that hanging clothes on a radiator forces it to work twice as hard.

Regular bleeds will ensure your radiator performs optimally. Run your hand over your unit - if it's cool at the top and warmer towards the bottom, it's bleeding time.

3. Insulate everything (but mostly your plumbing)

There's not much you can't insulate these days, but plumbing should always be your first port of call. Exposed pipes can be snugged up with slip-on foam tubing (available at most hardware stores), while boilers and water tanks can be easily dressed with jackets.

4. Use a thermostat to regulate your heating

The inbuilt timer will allow you to schedule your home's heating, so it powers down when you go out, and turns on automatically on your return - a boon for your living room, the environment, and your bank account.

5. Clean out your gutters

Get the ladder out, strap your gloves on, and prepare to get down and dirty. When your gutters are clear enough that water flows unimpeded, you're good to go.
