
Gold award for anti-bullying

The Glasgow Academy, which has a preparatory school for younger years in Milngavie, has become the first school in Britain to be accredited with the Diana Gold Award for anti-bullying.

The Diana Award was founded as a legacy to Diana, Princess of Wales' belief that young people have the power to change the world for the better. The Academy's Preparatory School has been working with The Diana Award since August 2017 to raise awareness of how to combat bullying in schools.

A team of Anti-Bullying Ambassadors from Primary 5 to 7 have developed a whole-school, peer-led approach to anti-bullying and have been instrumental in changing policies so that they are child-friendly, while putting in place support mechanisms for children to seek help if needed.

The Ambassadors worked with fellow pupils on scenarios that might occur in school and discussed potential solutions to various situations.



The Ambassadors are visible in the playground and children know who they can approach if they are feeling unhappy. They also work alongside playground friends to help children to play together safely.

Commenting on the achievement, The Glasgow Academy's Head of Preparatory School, Sandy Mathewson, said: "We are so proud of our pupils' achievement and we will continue to work tirelessly to ensure that bullying has no place in our School."

Alison added: "Volunteering provides immense personal satisfaction and is available to people of all ages, abilities and backgrounds.



A moving way to celebrate the past

Residents in Bearsden have found themselves stepping back in time after the introduction of specially designed picture shows.

Films are being automatically projected onto the pavements outside Bearsden Community Hub - between 5.30pm and 10.30pm daily.

They are being shown every evening - indefinitely - as part of the East Dunbartonshire Leisure and Culture (EDLC) Trust's Trails and Tales project, with similar films in Kirkintilloch.


The silent films have been specially created by artist Graeme Roger, using footage from the archives of the National Library of Scotland related to Bearsden and Kirkintilloch, alongside contemporary filmed portraits of local people. They also include new observational film of nearby landmarks and places.

During the process of creating the movies, Graeme held open days where people were invited to come along and be filmed - helping to illustrate the many unique characteristics of local life.

The archive footage ranges from 1913 to the 1980s - providing a portrait of the towns and their residents, including pipe bands and highland dancers.

The merging of these eras into new moving image artworks, with dramatic, large-scale portraits, is intended by the artist to remind people that 'life is for looking at'.

Trails and Tales - supported by the Heritage Lottery




Fund, East Dunbartonshire Council and Creative Scotland - has engaged a range of artists with communities to explore local history and heritage.

Councillor Billy Hendry, Convener of the Council's Place, Neighbourhood & Corporate Assets Committee, said: "You could find a forgotten world at your feet if you're walking past Bearsden Community Hub and Kirkintilloch Town Hall.

"This is a fascinating addition to both buildings - giving people a window into the past as part of the Trails and Tales programme, and helping to light up our town centres into the evening."

Sandy Marshall, Chair of EDLC Trust, added, "The films are an innovative way to bring the past to life. I hope they encourage people to engage with local heritage and the wonderful facilities on their doorstep, provided by the Trust and Council."

The Trails and Tales programme has included the creation of a series of outdoor sculptural arts and heritage trails, across towns and villages in East Dunbartonshire.

Increasing awareness with alerts

The system, run by Neighbourhood Watch Scotland, allows people to keep up to date with the latest news - including reports of doorstep crime, scams, burglaries and more in East Dunbartonshire.

Alerts are sent out by e-mail and/or by text. To sign up, complete the online form by visiting www. neighbourhoodwatchscotland.co.uk/sign-up-for-alerts.

If you do not have Internet access or need support, call Trading Standards on 0300 123 4510, and they will assist you in registering.

Councillor Billy Hendry, Convener of the Council's Place, Neighbourhood & Corporate Assets Committee, said: "I am pleased we have been able to work with our colleagues in Police Scotland to develop East Dunbartonshire Community Alerts, which will help to keep residents safe.

"Our Trading Standards team works closely with Police Scotland and a range of partners to help raise



awareness and provide advice on avoiding bogus callers and rogue traders."

Chief Inspector Gerry Corrigan, Local Area Commander - Police Scotland, added: "We enjoy a fantastic relationship with our Trading Standards officers, which has resulted in increased detections for bogus crime in our area.

"By signing up to East Dunbartonshire Community Alerts we can increase awareness for residents in real time when we become aware of ongoing incidents that impact the community, as well as alerting them to emerging crime trends relating to fraudulent schemes.

Creating cleaner, healthier play parks

Pupils from Bearsden and Milngavie have helped ensure local play parks are now green, smokefree places thanks to their posters showing a strong message to adults not to smoke where children play.

Since 2016, the East Dunbartonshire Tobacco Alliance has worked with hundreds of pupils to design signage for parks in Auchinairn, Baljaffray, Bishopbriggs, Harestanes, Lennoxtown, Milton of Campsie and Torrance to promote smoke-free play zones.

The latest project involved 200 P6 pupils from Killermont Primary, Mosshead Primary and St. Nicholas' Primary Schools in Bearsden and Clober Primary in Milngavie learning about the dangers of smoking and second-hand smoke and designing posters to promote smoke-free parks.

The winning design, by St. Nicholas' Primary pupils Kaitlin, Gabriela and Olivia, will soon feature on signage in 18 parks across Bearsden and Milngavie, letting smokers know that cigarettes are not welcome.

The striking artwork depicts a colourful scene of a busy, fun-filled play park where children ask 'Please



keep our playpark smoke-free'.

Susan Manion, Chief Officer for East Dunbartonshire HSCP, said: "We are proud to support the smoke free play parks initiative that supports children having a clean, safe and smoke free environment in which to play. By reducing children's exposure to tobacco smoke, we hope that in time smoking will no longer be seen as a 'normal' activity in today's society."

There are 67 play areas in East Dunbartonshire and by 2021, all will be smoke-free as work will begin in Kirkintilloch and Lenzie next year.

New changes for childcare funding

Childcare funding will now be provided for East Dunbartonshire residents from the day after a child's 3rd birthday.

The Council have announced the funding will be available from August 2019 for children attending East Dunbartonshire Council Early Learning and Childcare Centres and approved, privately-run childcare providers.

Previously, childcare funding commenced the school term following a child's 3rd birthday however, parents who have applied for funded childcare during the academic year 2019/2020 will shortly receive letters advising them of the changes.

This is also good news for parents whose children turn three between 1 March 2020 and 26 June 2020, as they are now entitled to funded childcare during the 2019/2020 academic year. Parents of eligible children can apply to receive this funding via the Council's website.

Parents are advised that applications must be received by 30 August 2019 and they will be notified of allocated places by 30 September. Start dates will



be subject to holidays and settling in periods and places will be subject to availability. If no places are available in a chosen centre, a place will be offered in a centre where places are available.

Convener of Education, Councillor Jim Goodall, said: "The Council is working towards delivering 1140 hours funded Early Learning and Childcare by 2020 and in order to achieve this we have been introducing additional provision and extended hours."





Selling your house this summer?

Here are six tips to get your front garden looking its best.

1. Tidy up

If you have tools, buckets, outdoor toys and other ephemera peppering your front garden area, move them out of sight.

2. Sort out quick planting

If you have harsh concrete steps,
