



Glasgow Pride Parade PRIDE sweeps through city

A SPLASH of colour burst through Merchant city as thousands

descended for the city's Pride festival.

Pride Glasgow. described organisers as Scotland's largest LGBTI festival, took place at Glasgow Green in August to hundreds of enthusiastic supporters - and even the Duke of

Wellington dressed for the occasion. The event also featured a parade through the heart of the city on Saturday.

Around 5,000 revellers took part in the parade, with 10 times that number thought to have watched it snake through the city centre and Merchant City areas.

First Minister Nicola Sturgeon made an appearance too, addressing the crowds with a speech. This made her the first serving first minister to speak at a pride event.

A range of entertainment, headlined by 90s Irish pop sensation B*Witched took place over the two days at Glasgow Green. X Factor runner up Saara Aalto and dance singer Kelly Llorenna also took to the stage.

Pubs heritage saved from demolition

ONE of the oldest pubs in Merchant City narrowly avoided demolition when developers had to rethink plans to build a new student residence block in the area.

Structured House Group agreed to retain and refurbish the Old College Bar on its existing site with its current interior reproduced in an identical form.

The building, parts of which are believed to date back to the late 15th Century, is not listed but there has been a pub on the site since the early 1800s and it retains a fond place in Glaswegians' hearts.

Developers originally felt that because of the poor state of the building, located on a site over a railway tunnel fraught with safety and structural issues, it would have to be removed.

The company plans to build a 12-story complex on the site to meet a burgeoning demand for student accommodation in the city.

The £40 million plan will create a 401-bed student complex on the corner of High Street and George Street that would also feature restaurants and shops.

Co-working offices will also be installed where locals and university start-ups can utilise the space




and raise start-up capital.

Craig Inglis, chief executive of SHG, said: "As a Glasgow-based company, we have enormous respect for the city's built heritage and we recognise the important place that The Old College Bar holds.

"We've worked with city council planners, universities and local businesses on our design for the past two and a half years to create an iconic building that will stand tall as an entrance to the city from the East."





New plans for luxury homes

CANDLERIGGS is set for a revamp after former city centre student flats, which were closed following claims they were damp and mouldy, could be converted into luxury homes for sale and rent.

In 1989, a 19th century warehouse in Candleriggs was turned into student accommodation but in recent years there were complaints the property suffered from damp, mould and rot.

Strathclyde University decided to close Patrick Thomas Court and moved the young residents elsewhere.

It is understood they paid them a total of almost £200,000 in compensation.

Kelvin Property has now applied to the city council for full planning permission to convert the student accommodation into mainstream flats.

There will be no major work to the exterior of the building but the interior will be substantially reconfigured.

A design brief from the developer says the plans will result in significant improvements in the quality of accommodation at Patrick Thomas Court.

It adds: "This in turn will have real benefits in maintaining and enhancing the Merchant City environment by improving the residential capacity of this part of the city, in turn providing security to evening street life and demand for local businesses."


The brief says converting the existing accommodation will significantly improve the quality of the flats with both external courtyards and internal layouts being fully refurbished.

Decoration, services and fittings will be upgraded and the existing 102 student rooms reduced to 69.

The developer says: "Those people wishing to stay in the heart of the Merchant City will not be expecting extensive views.

"As for the neighbours, there will be little difference between the previous occupation of the rooms by students and the new occupation by tenants.

"Indeed, the new tenants will be more likely to take care of the local environment and less likely to act as bad neighbours."

As well as helping create a relaxed ambience in the homes of the rich and famous, Shearer Candles helped light up the homes of families across the city during the miner's strike blackouts.

From modest beginnings in the Candleriggs area, Shearers now makes around 3.2million scented candles a year for hotels, restaurants and homes and the odd celebrity. The most famous they will disclose is Madonna

The Govan-based company was asked to supply the candles for the pop legend's Highland wedding when she married Guy Ritchie at Skibo Castle in Dornoch in 2000.

Rosey Barnet, creative director, said: "One of my caterers phoned me up and said they wanted some red candles.

"It had to be a particular colour and he wouldn't tell me who they were for.



"When the security van came to pick them up and I said, 'you are going to have to tell me who they are for.'

"It was for Madonna's wedding. It was just plain red, they weren't scented.

"George Michael used to buy a lot of Persian Lime.

"When we had the old factory one of the hotels phoned up and asked, did we sell candles to the public.

"At that time, we were in the old factor, with a tiny reception area. The huge black limo pulled up and four big leather-clad bodyguards got out and then out popped Janet Jackson.

"She bought sandlewood candles for her tour."

Cash boost helps to maintain the life of Barrowland Park

WITH extra funding awarded, the life of the popular temporary park has been extended.

Barrowland Park was created for the Commonwealth Games in 2014 at the site of the historic Schipka Pass in the Calton.

It was set up with Stalled Spaces cash as part of the Calton Barras Action plan with locals campaigning to have the space made a permanent feature.

Now council bosses have confirmed they are giving another £6000 to keep the park in place until 2018. But they said the stay of execution does not mean Barrowland Park will be kept.

A Glasgow City Council spokesman said: "We have extended maintenance funding for Barrowland Park into 2018.

"It should be remembered that while the park - by its nature as a stalled space - was always intended to be temporary, the artwork will always have a home in the Barras/Calton area.

"We are delighted by its continuing popularity with

local people and visitors."

Barrowland Park includes the Barrowlands Album Pathway - a brightly coloured walkway listing more than 2000 bands that have played at the famous Barrowlands Ballroom.

Sonic Youth, The Smiths and The Kinks have all earned their place on the walkway, which was created by former Turner Prize nominee Jim Lambie.

Prior to its transformation the space, bounded by the Gallowgate, London Road and Moir Street, had lain derelict.

It was transformed into a park on July 19 2014 thanks to £700,000 of funding and earlier this year music fans gathered to celebrate its third anniversary.

Fans of Barrowland Park have campaigned to keep it as a permanent greenspace.

The group said it is pleased to learn the council will continue upkeep of the park until next year but that the council pledge does not go far enough.



Innovative boost for business

BUSINESS opportunities boom in Glasgow with former council offices being used as a launch pad for hi-tech space companies.

The Tontine Building in Trongate has celebrated its first anniversary of new firms moving in and the operators have declared the first year a success.

It has been turned into an incubation space for new small and medium size businesses to help them grow and move out into other premises.

The centre helps new businesses in the technology, design and manufacturing sectors have an office space with all the facilities they need.

It targets high growth potential businesses who will expand quickly then move out when they are ready, allowing new firms to move in and grow.

It has been funded with City Deal cash and is already at 90% capacity after its first year.

Susan Aitken, Glasgow City Council Leader, took a tour of the building and met with new and

growing businesses at the facility.

She said: "I am delighted by the ongoing success of The Tontine, creating high-quality jobs and growth in these key sectors of Glasgow's current and future economy.

"The performance in the first year is even better than expected, showing how effective this type of supportive environment for growing businesses is.

"The Tontine is undoubtedly a great success story for the Glasgow City Region City Deal, and is poised to play a key role in the city's economic growth over the next four years."

The council hopes that by 2021 there will be 134 businesses supported at the Tontine and each will be expected to grow by at least four staff.

If targets are met it would mean 536 new jobs and an increase in turnover of more than £50m.

The building where the Tontine is now, at one time housed the workshop of steam engine pioneer James Watt.



Autumn fitness advice to see you through the season

Autumn is nearly here, folks. The good news: time to dust off those glorious boots and jumpers. The not-so-good news: time for the annual onslaught of winter bugs and feeling generally under the weather.

But it doesn't have to be that way -well not entirely, at least. While you can't completely avoid catching bugs and colds, you can give your immune system a helping hand (and no, that doesn't mean shoving a load of 'vitamin-boost' fizzy tablets in your drawer to guzzle when you're run down).

Here, Rob Hobson, Healthspan nutritionist and author of Detox Kitchen Bible Cookbook, and personal trainer Mollie Millington, share top tips for the exercise and diet tweaks to make now to keep you well through winter...



1. Embrace the season

A healthy, balanced diet is key for good health - but do you find it easier to eat healthily during summertime? Making the switch to winter doesn't have to mean letting all those healthy habits slip. "Swapping berries and salads for root vegetables, apples and pears is just as healthy," says Rob. "The problem is that the cold weather and dark evenings often leave us craving comfort foods that we find nurturing.




2. Be supplement savvy

Lots of us only think about packing in extra vitamins once we actually feel unwell, but our immune systems function best if they're supported continually, so consider starting to take a quality multivitamin now, if you don't already. "As a general all-rounder, a multivitamin and mineral is a good, cost-effective way to fill any shortfalls in your diet, and supply you with the nutrients typically associated with immunity, such as zinc and vitamin C.

"There are some nutrients that are typically lacking in the diet during winter, such as vitamin D, so I would advise taking this from October onwards." he adds.

3. Get spicy

Tis the season of hearty soups, stews and casseroles, and spices are an easy way to add some oomph in the healthiness - as well as the taste - stakes. Take inspiration from your favourite coffee shop chains and add warming spices to hot drinks, porridge and breakfast smoothies. "I am a big fan of incorporating lots of spices into your diet all year round. There is always one for every occasion, dish or drink," says Rob. "Spices not only contain a good source of minerals, such as iron, magnesium and calcium, but many contain anti-inflammatory compounds, such as cir curnin, found in turmeric."



4. Don't let the weather stop you getting outside

Invest in suitable footwear and a waterproof jacket and you'll never need to let the weather stop you from getting outdoors to walk. If walking to work isn't an option, or it's too dark, Mollie suggests getting in a little earlier "and then use 30 minutes before work to walk briskly around your office building".

5. Switch to lunchtime workouts

Being physically active also plays a vital role in helping your immune system do its job. If you know the dark mornings and evenings are going to hamper your usual workout regime, switch things up and make the most of lunchtimes and early afternoons to fit in some exercise. Circumstances permitting, check out afternoon classes



at nearby gyms ("Many gyms offer cheaper classes during the day, as the classes are less popular," notes Mollie) or make use of nearby parks for jogging.

You could even work in some HIIT and yoga sessions without having to leave the office or spend any money - thanks to the internet and wealth of free fitness videos on YouTube, "There are 100-plus free workouts on website (ptmollie.com) my that require little or no gym equipment. They take 15 minutes, so you could also do these at work on your lunch break with colleagues," says Mollie.
