Painting exhibition comes to Merchant City



LOCAL artist Robert Miller is set to showcase his work in a brand new exhibition taking place in Merchant City.

Robert, 62, who hails from Bridgeton, has a flair for painting portraits that capture the detail, essence and complexities of the person painted. Whether it's a family portrait or a famous celebrity, his work has gained many appreciators, with paintings selling for up to £11,000 in charity auctions.

"Art has been in my blood since I was young. When I was a



blue-eyed boy at primary school I received the highest mark for my work and a love for painting has continued ever since," explained Robert.

Since discovering his talent at a young age, Robert took a stint at art school before turning to carpet design for a couple of years. Today he is a member of a band and paints commissions and other pieces for both work and pleasure.

"About ten years ago a friend of mine was managing an art space in East Kilbride and happened to see one of my paintings. He insisted I exhibit my work and since then I've been painting a lot more frequently and putting on exhibitions whenever possible."

"I particularly love painting old men - and beautiful women! When painting older people, there's so much detail in their face and there's a story behind the eyes."

THE 2017 Celtic Connections programme has launched and is back in dazzling form.

From Thursday 19 January to Sunday 5 February, 2,100 musicians from across the globe will take part in 300 events at venues throughout Glasgow for one of the leading annual festivals of world, folk and roots music.

18 days of concerts, ceilidhs, talks, art exhibitions, workshops, free events, late night sessions and a host of special one-off musical collaborations will once again light up the Scottish winter when Celtic Connections returns.

The Opening Concert will star award winning folk singer songwriter Laura Marling performing the world premiere of orchestrations of her songs by Kate St. John with the BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra and special guests.

This concert begins Celtic Connections 2017's celebration of inspiring women artists, with performances by Roberta Sá, Olivia Newton John with Beth Neilson Chapman, Karine Polwart, and legendary singer Shirley Collins among the other highlights.

The festival also focuses this year on artists who have lived through times of intense personal hardships and found success through their music and strength, such as world music star Aziza Brahim who grew up in an Algerian refugee camp.

Other artists appearing include C Duncan, Pictish Trail, Fairport Convention, Liz Lochhead, Aidan Moffat, Seth Lakeman, Tom Paxton, King Creosote, Siobhan Miller, Orchestra Baobab, Robyn Stapleton, and Anna Meredith.

AN evening of flaring, throwing and judging took place at Hard Rock Café Glasgow recently, as bartenders from as far as Berlin battled it out in the regional finals of the BARocker Championship. An annual global competition, the championship sees Hard Rock scour 165 of its Cafes in 70 countries around the world to find the best at keeping the barrocking. After heated head-toheads in Cafes around the world, the Europe

finals saw seven hopefuls mix it out for the chance to compete in the world finals in Panama City, Panama, at Hard Rock's annual Global Conference in January 2017.

The hottest bartenders from across Europe gathered in the restaurant on 28 October and put on a show for bartending experts and



cocktail fans alike. In a celebration of all things mixology, STV Glasgow's Laura Boyd and Gerry Cassidy reprised their role as judges.

Flying the flag for the Glasgow branch, bartender Matthew Lyle, 28, chatted to Merchant City Connect ahead of the competition.

"I've been flairing for years all over the world – in London, Greece, Spain and now Glasgow. It take a lot of practise and a real passion for flairing to succeed."

Brought to the big screen in 1988 in Tom Cruise's Cocktail, flairing is akin to performance art, with bartenders

entertaining people by manipulating bottles, shakers and bar tools in weird and wonderful ways.

"It takes years to get to the stage where you're not simply mimicking others, but bringing your own unique style to your routine. One of my signature moves involves using two tins, but where the real magic lies is the personality each bartender brings."

A 400-room swish hotel set to be built in the area

A NEW luxury hotel is pipped to be built on a car park site in Merchant City.

Glasgow City Council's Executive Committee recently gave the green light for the sale of 69-97 Ingram Street to Merchant Hotel Glasgow Limited for the development of a hotel.

The proposed hotel will be of high quality, with almost 400 bedrooms, two restaurants, two entrances, a bar and coffee shop built on a site of 0.62 acres.

The aim of the creation is to provide a focal point for Merchant City, attracting both hotel guests and visitors to the area. Merchant Hotel Glasgow Limited will pay Glasgow City Council - the owner of the site - a single payment of £6.75million on the date of entry.

Councillor Frank McAveety, Leader of Glasgow City Council, said: "The Merchant City is already a fantastically successful attraction in Glasgow, and the development of a high quality hotel such as one proposed for Ingram Street could help to take the area to another level.

"Buildings such as this can play a key role in Glasgow's day and night-time economies."

Bridge gets royal recognition



One of Glasgow's landmark bridges was given the royal seal of approval after having a £3.4m restoration taking it back to its former glory.

GLASGOW'S historic Albert Bridge received the Royal seal of approval in October when HRH The Earl of Wessex paid a visit following the bridge's £3.4m restoration.

The Albert Bridge originally opened in June 1871 and cost £62,328. It is named after Prince Albert, The Earl of Wessex's Great, great, great grandfather.

It was the third road bridge built over the River Clyde in Glasgow, following the Victoria Bridge and Glasgow Bridge.

Glasgow City Council appointed Balfour Beatty to restore the 145 year old Category Alisted Victorian structure and bring it back to its original form. Work began in May 2015 with completion earlier this year. The £3.4m restoration included the complete refurbishment of the metalwork, restoring and repainting the Glasgow City and heraldic crests, replacing the damaged parapets and installing new ornate street lamps to match, as close as possible, the original gas lamp standards - a feature of the original construction.

A plaque commemorating its restoration was unveiled by HRH The Earl of Wessex, after meeting with and speaking to those directly involved in the project.

Bailie Elaine McDougall, the council's Executive Member for Transport, Environment and Sustainability, said: "The restoration of the Albert Bridge is remarkable.

"Glasgow is a city built on our reputation for engineering and we

are committed to protecting our heritage as much as we possibly can.

"This is a 145 year old structure of significant historical importance and I'm delighted that the multimillion pound investment by the city council to bring it back to its original form has been so successful.

"Restoring a bridge of this size, scale and age is no easy task and yet the results are amazing.

"Everyone involved in the project should be very, very proud."

There were four previous bridges at this site (the current bridge being number five).

The Albert Bridge links the Saltmarket in the city centre with Crown Street on the south side.
