Park looks bloomin' lovely

BURSTS of colour filled the air as thousands of people flocked to Roucken Glen Park earlier this summer.

Visitors came out in force to celebrate the completion of a four-year, £3m restoration project. It has seen much loved features given a new lease of life, new visitor interpretation signage installed and the discovery of important archaeological relics.

The celebration day featured music - both recitals in the walled garden and performances on the main stage - heritage walks, an ecozone, traditional fairground rides, puppet shows, storytelling, croquet, giant chess, a farmers' market and festival of colour, which should see visitor figures push ever closer to the one million mark.

In a testament to the initiative, the number of visitors to the park has doubled over the life of the project, from 406,638 in 2011 (the year prior to the project) to 942,568 last year. That



places it in the number two spot in the Scottish Visitor Attraction Monitor table of Scotland's top Outdoor Nature Attractions - behind only Strathclyde Country Park.

The project attracted £2.15m from the Heritage Lottery Fund, with a further £1m coming from East Renfrewshire Council.

Councillor Vincent Waters said: "Rouken Glen holds a very special place in the heart of visitors and I'm thrilled to see it restored to its former glory."

NEWTON Mearns residents are invited to attend the next blood donation session, taking place at Church of Broom.

On Wednesday 30 November, the Scottish National Blood Transfusion Service will set up shop at the church on Broom Road East.

The event will offer the ideal opportunity for people to pay it forward and make a real difference not only in their own community, but the whole of Scotland.

The first session will kick off at 2pm and run until 3.45pm, and the second session will run from 5.15pm until 7.30pm. The dedicated team will be on hand to offer a warm welcome to all.



The process of giving blood is quick and simple.

After filling in a donor health check questionnaire and having a check-up from a nurse, a donor's haemoglobin (iron) level will be tested to ensure they can actually spare a pint of blood.

Once everything is checked and in order, they will then make their donation.

Each donation takes around 10 to 15 minutes and staff aim

to take around 470mls of blood - with additional samples for testing.

This may sound like a lot but is actually less than a pint in total.

Donors will have a team member with them at all times to ensure they are comfortable and happy with the process.

Every day Scottish patients receive life-enhancing or lifesaving treatments using the blood donated.

Within 24 hours of a donation, blood is processed, tested and available for use.

However, figures reveal that only five per cent of the population currently give blood.

Hidden gems rediscovered at Rouken Glen Park

IT goes to show what can be uncovered with a good tidy-up, after Rouken Glen was discovered to have a secondary waterfall, weir, flagstone path and dam walls built by the Victorians.

It was during a recent restoration project that the relics were found at the popular East Renfrewshire park.

Just a short drive from Newton Mearns, the hidden gems were revealed when work began to open up unused parts of the park earlier this year.

The historical find also brings back to life an area known as 'Lovers' Walk', which includes original exposed iron beams and wooden boards.

The discoveries allow visitors to witness remnants of the park's industrial and social heritage.

Visitors can experience the park's natural environment as it would have looked more than 200 years ago and walk in the footsteps of textile workers who worked at the Newfield printworks in what is now Rouken Glen Park.



To preserve links to the area's past the works restored the Glen Path whilst maintaining historic

relics, trees and habitats, working with the natural topography of the woodland.

The project was funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund and East Renfrewshire Council as part of an overall £3.2m investment in Rouken Glen.

Local volunteers helped carry out the excavation works and studied the history of the area to uncover the site's importance.

There are now plans to introduce historical walks in this part of the park.

The newly restored Glen Path network is to the right of the main entrance to the park on Rouken Glen Road and loops all the way up to the boating pond.

Phil Richardson, project manager from Archaeology Scotland, said: "This rediscovery is of huge significance. The west side of Rouken Glen and the Glen Path area would have been the main engine room of the textile industry about 200 years ago.

"The Victorians re-routed and enhanced the burn to build a water management system that would control the flow of the water and be used to power the mill. It was important to the Crum family who owned the park and the local printworks that it was powered by nature."

Kerb appeal

HOPING to pave the way for a safer future, East Renfrewshire Good Causes (ERGC) is appealing for safer pavements on behalf of residents of a local, semi-sheltered housing complex in Newton Mearns.

Propelled by their ethos, which encourages us all to "Love our Neighbours", ERGC are hoping to highlight an access problem causing many elderly people and parents with strollers to risk their safety.

Russell Macmillan, founder of ERGC, started noticing many elderly residents walking on local roads instead of pavements. He said: "With an increasingly ageing local population, it is essential that our pavements and kerbs which allow basic daily tasks like going to the shops, take account of difficulties faced by the elderly, parents with prams and mobility impaired disabled people.

"For the elderly, both uneven and the camber on the pavement can be a real disincentive, and can lead to many using the roads instead, which poses a real potential danger".

"The things we take for granted can become more problematic with the ageing process. As a registered blind man myself, I am only too aware of how easy it is to take things for granted, as I did prior to losing my eyesight, to its current 4% level.

"With ageing often comes difficulty with balance, strength and an increase likelihood of falls, which can be disastrous for the elderly, and lead to hospital admission, becoming housebound not to mention the psychological loss of confidence. With this in mind, Russell approached local labour councillor lan McAlpine, to look into this issue on behalf of the many residents potentially affected both now and in the future."

Ian McAlpine, said: "When you walk the route



with a stroller, you quickly realise the obstacles that our mobility impaired local resident's face when carrying out such a basic daily task like going shopping.

"In my role as labour councillor for Newton Mearns South, I am naturally delighted to spearhead this latest ERGoodCauses appeal to improve access for my constituents, which will raise the local standard".

One of the many local residents who mobilises with the help of a stroller is ex-serviceman, Mr David McGill, now in his early 90s. He spoke up on behalf of other residents of Shaw Court: "It is good to see councillor McAlpine trying to help improve the lives of some of our senior members who live independently in the community".
