The grass is greener with career that helps children

After experiencing life as a golf pro, a Newton Mearns man has swapped the putting green for the classroom as he takes on his new role as a nursery child development officer.

Paul Morrison (pictured) worked as a golf professional for 13 years before deciding it was time to look for a new challenge.

The former St Ninian's High pupil successfully completed a Higher National Certificate (HNC) qualification in Early Childhood Practice and is sure he made the right call.

Paul. 44. told Connect's sister title the Barrhead News: "I realised a boyhood dream by going into the golf trade but, after many years, I felt as though I wanted a change in career.

"I had always considered being a school teacher and, through working in schools doing golf coaching sessions, knew that I enjoyed being in the school environment, so I initially went onto the supply register for Pupil Support Assistants (PSA) and started at Isobel Mair School soon after. "From the very beginning I loved it and being in the Additional Support Needs (ASN) environment meant I was learning so many new skills all the time."

Having spent six years working as a PSA at Isobel Mair School. an opportunity arose for Paul to



go back to college to gain a new qualification.

East Renfrewshire Council provided the chance for a number of clerical staff and PSAs to enrol in a course at West College Scotland to complete a HNC in Early Childhood Practice.

Beat the street returns...

After valiant efforts last year, a new initiative aiming to boost health and wellbeing is being rolled out across the rest of East Renfrewshire.

Beat the Street is a free challenge in which people are rewarded with points and prizes for exploring their town or village on foot or bicycle.

The game was a runaway success when it was staged in Barrhead and Newton Mearns last year as, within the first few days of its launch, residents had collectively travelled more than the distance to Australia.

Now organisers of Beat the Street are bringing the game to Neilston, Giffnock, Thornliebank, Clarkston, Busby, Eaglesham and Waterfoot in an effort to

encourage people to get out and about. Beeping and flashing sensors called Beat Boxes have placed on lamp-posts been around these areas.

Players can tap the Beat Boxes, spaced half a mile apart. using cards and fobs to track their journey and earn points for themselves and their team.

Last year, 17 schools and teams in the Barrhead and Newton Mearns areas competed against each other to see who could journey the furthest and win hundreds of pounds worth of prizes. The Beat the Street game is being delivered by Intelligent Health on behalf of Renfrewshire Council. with support from Paths for All's Smarter Choices, Smarter

Councillor Tony Buchanan. leader of Fast Renfrewshire Council, said: "Beat the Street is a fun way to get active and we're delighted to bring the game back to East Renfrewshire."

A Newton Mearns school's improving exam results has been attributed to the Scottish Government's building improvement

Eastwood High saw the percentage of fifth year pupils achieving five or more Highers increase to 40 per cent, compared to 17 per cent before moving to its new site. New high-tech retirement homes open in Mearns

Funds raised for local running race event

Thousands of pounds has been presented in a bid to encourage more residents to join one of the areas most popular running events.

EventScotland has awarded Run the Blades £21,000 towards the dash around the UK's largest onshore windfarm, Whitelee, on the Eaglesham Moor.

Set for July 17 and 18, the 2020 event will expand beyond the current 10km, half-marathon and 50km ultra-marathon.

There will now also be a 'children's mile' after the half-marathon and a 'Ride the Blades' event that will introduce mountain biking on the route.

The cash will help support transport, marguee and eauipment hire.

Lee Payton, director of Breaking Strain Events, which organises Run the Blades, said: "We're delighted to receive support from EventScotland for the third year in succession.

"Over the past two years, alongside EventScotland and headline sponsor ScottishPower, we're proud of the fact that Run the Blades has been an accessible



event for runners of all fitness and experience levels.

"In 2018 we had our first visually impaired runner and last year our first wheelchair competitor took on the 10K. This year our focus is on reducing our use of single-use plastic through innovative water supplies at checkpoints, increasing our recycling and eliminating our waste to landfill."

Gordon Smith, VisitScotland's regional director, added: "I am delighted that this popular East Renfrewshire event is to receive funding from EventScotland's National Programme Fund. This funding will enable the event to build on its success."

Council chiefs target pothole repairs...

A list of streets in Newton Mearns have been added to East Renfrewshire Council's repairs programme in a bid to fix any hazardous roads in the area.

The additions have been confirmed after Eastwood MSP Jackson Carlaw raised concerns over the condition of a number of roads in his constituency.

The draft repairs programme for the 2020/21 financial year now includes Alloway Drive, in Newton Mearns, as well as Mearns Road (from Hillview Drive to Clarkston Toll) and the section of Greenwood Road between Buccleuch Avenue and Richmond Avenue, in Clarkston.

Council chiefs also confirmed that the section of Broompark Drive from Sandringham Avenue to Lochbroom Road, in Newton Mearns, is set to undergo resurfacing work as early as this month.

Other roads the council intends to repair in Newton Mearns over the next financial year are Ayr Road, Broomfield Avenue, Broomvale Drive, Doune Crescent, Sandringham Avenue, Turnberry Drive, Humbie Road, Eaglesham Road, Meadowhill, Teawell



Road, Warnock Road and Douglas Drive.

Mr Carlaw said: "The surfaces of many roads across Eastwood are in a dire state and they have been left in such condition for a long period of time.

"Potholes, uneven surfaces, ruts and cracks remain a huge problem for a very significant number of local roads.

"It is welcome that, in response to my recent representations, the council have confirmed their intention to carry out repair work on roads such as Alloway Drive, the section of Mearns Road from Hillview Drive to Clarkston Toll and part of Greenwood Road in the next financial year."

Residents in need are being urged to use welfare fund for support with living costs

The local council is reminding any local residents who may find themselves with

financial struggles at this time of year that they can apply to the Scottish Welfare Fund for help with essential living costs.

The Scottish Welfare Fund is open to those on low income who need help with food or heating costs.

There are two grants within the fund – the Crisis Grant, which is available to those in a crisis situation such as a fire or flood in the home or unexpected financial hardship, and the Community Care Grant, which helps with costs to live in the community or keep a family together.

Once a Crisis Grant application has been made, the council will make a decision no later than the end of

the next working day. The grant is tax free and doesn't need to be paid back.

Councillor Danny Devlin, East Renfrewshire's housing and maintenance services convener, said: "The festive period can be especially difficult for those on a low income or experiencing a crisis. However, the Scottish Welfare Fund is in place to help mitigate in these situations.

"I encourage anyone facing hardship to get in touch with our staff, who'll be able to explain the process and assist in making an application."

Faded Glamour gives us a glimpse into not only Lowe's own home, but also the


> private spaces of her super-creative designer friends, including Solange Azagury-

Bring summertime into your garden

Plant lilies, red hot pokers and even summer hyacinths in spring for a burst of summer scent and colour.

The majority produce their best blooms when planted in a sunny spot, although lilies and begonias bloom well in partial shade. There are many to choose from; here's some ideas and key points to keep in mind...

Long, short and tall

Hyacinths are generally known as highly-scented spring bulbs, but there is also a summer hyacinth, Galtonia candicans, which grows to 1m (3ft) high and makes big clumps of straplike leaves, producing white, bellshaped flowers in summer. They should be planted in late spring.

Long after your tulips have faded, foxtail lilies (Eremurus species) are producing towering spires of flowers as high as 3m (9ft), clumps of Crinum x powellii are producing beautiful pink blooms, while in August and September red hot pokers (Kniphofias) are among the most impressive border plants.

They prefer a sunny, sheltered spot and will need a good dry mulch come the autumn. Those in containers will benefit from being brought under cover into a cool, frost-free place.

Luscious lilies

Lilies are among the most popular summer bulbs. They perform well in pots and if you want their rich scent to pervade your patio, go for L. longiflorum, which will produce wonderful white flowers and fragrance on a sunny terrace.

They are best grown in large pots of John Innes compost in autumn or early spring, in a frost-free greenhouse or conservatory. Don't put them outside until the frosts have passed.

One of the easiest lilies to grow is the tiger lily (Lilium tigrinum), which grows to 1.25m (4ft) and produces striking orange-spotted flowers with petals which curve in to make a ball shape. Again, they can be planted in early spring in lime-free soil, which is well-drained.

How to create a garden that will soothe the mind

As focus on the wellbeing benefits of plants and nature grows, you might fancy creating a garden mindfulness corner of your own. Here's how to do it...

What should you include?

"Key elements of life, like shelter and water, are relevant to a mindfulness corner, which is trying to create a

refuge but with an ability view outside of that," says RHS scientist Alistair Griffiths.

Where do you start?

"Create an area of seating where vou can sit alone, or friends family," and he suggests. Try to make room for plants which attract butterflies, bees

and wildlife to distract you from everyday life.

Think about water

It's good to have an element of water, where you have the ability to see and hear the water and look at its reflectiveness, he advises.

And if you only have a balcony, or no outdoor space at all?

"Bring nature indoors." Griffiths. "You can make mindfulness corner in your house. bringing greenery into those spaces, which will be more critical

in relation to the future.

Focus on fragrance

"Scent is critical," says Griffiths. "Choose thinas which are fragrant. There's scientific evidence lavender linking calm and sleep. The



beautv of lavender that it attracts bees and other distractions [too]."

Consider colour

"A mindfulness corner about trvina surround yourself with different types greens, because green is a colour that seems to be universally liked by people across the world, as is blue,"

Wildlife is important

"Even if you live in a high-rise flats, have bird feeders. Bees also get up there and other wildlife will find it. Having things that attract wildlife is a key aspect," says Griffiths.

Have elements of touch

"Include plants around touch. such as soft ornamental grasses, the sort of plants that you want to run your hand through when you walk past," suggests Griffiths.
