## Free gym membership rolled out for veterans is welcomed

A free health and wellbeing programme for local veterans is the first of its kind in the country.

The Health for Heroes programme being offered by East Renfrewshire Culture and Leisure (ERCL) gives armed forces, army, navy and air force veterans a free gym and fitness membership, as well as access to one-to-one and group sessions.

They can also go along to Live Active sessions twice a week with support from expert health advisors, who have been trained to carry out health and well-being consultations and can provide a personal exercise, nutrition and fitness plan.

Membership includes unlimited

access to ERCL's gyms, pools, fitness classes and health suites at each of their four East Renfrewshire locations.

Already 14 veterans are signed up to the scheme in East Renfrewshire and there are plans for other regions to offer a similar programme.

"The gym membership has really worked out for my health. Going to the gym and doing yoga every week has been great for my physical fitness and boosting my mental health - it makes me feel like I'm doing the right thing for my wellbeing," said David Martin from Barrhead.

"I've lost 2.5 stone, thanks to a combination of a good diet and exercise." David served in Afghanistan with the army in 2011 and 2012. He was discharged in 2015 after being in a coma and suffering a brain injury following a car crash.

David's next door neighbour, James, joined the army in 1972 and served in Northern Ireland.

"Coming to the gym, playing badminton with a friend or going for a swim is good therapy," said James. "Veterans stick together, so David and I keep an eye out for each other. I'm also part of a new peer support groups for veterans, which has just started at Barrhead Foundry."

Tickets for the 2020 event are priced at  $\pounds$ 39.50 for adults and  $\pounds$ 24.50 for children and are now on sale.

## Strain on foodbanks

Food banks in East Renfrewshire have seen an 18 per cent increase in the number of emergency food parcels handed out, compared to last year.

It adds up to 12 packages of food aid every day, with more than a third going to children.

The UK's biggest food bank network the Trussell Trust recorded its busiest ever six-month period between April and September, with more than 823,000 parcels provided to people in need.

In East Renfrewshire, the charity says it handed out 2,247 three-day emergency food parcels over the period.

Trussell Trust chief executive Emma Revie warned that problems with Universal Credit were pushing people into poverty, with the five-week wait for initial payments under the system a key factor behind food bank use.

"Our benefits system is supposed to protect us all from being swept into poverty, but currently thousands of women, men and children are not receiving sufficient protection from destitution," she said.

"This is not right. But we know this situation can be fixed – our benefits system could be the key to unlocking people from poverty.

"It's in our power as a country to end the need for food banks. This can change."

Meanwhile, a spokeswoman from the Department for Work and Pensions said: "We spend over £95 billion a year on welfare, and have simplified the benefits system through Universal Credit.

"Free school meals are provided for 1.3 million disadvantaged children."

## Memory of local dad honoured

#### A fundraising drive to support men's mental health has been set up in memory of a Newton Mearns dad.

Alan Foulkes, 41, died after a short battle with suspected peritonitis, an infection of the inner lining of the stomach.

His memory will live on, thanks to his family, including his wife Helen and sons Craig and Ross, aged 16 and 18.

Mourners at Alan's funeral were asked to support a donation to Barrhead's Men Shed, which provides a space for people to come together and share their love of DIY.

Alan's parents, Ray and Gillian, said they hope the money donated will mean men who are feeling isolated will be able to get the support they need.

"Alan was always interested in doing things and we used to put up fences and the like," said 74-yearold Ray. "We have a house in France and he helped us with it over the years.

"He would have really appreciated the work that goes on at the Men's Shed. He loved his tools - my

garage is still full of them.

"It was suggested to us that the Men's Shed

is a cause that would be close to Alan's heart, so we wanted to support the local one."

Ray visited the group's Robertson Street hub to present a cheque for around £400. The Men's Shed has wasted little time in putting the money to good use, by buying a new saw which will also include a plaque inscribed with Alan's name.

"It is great what they are doing for men in the area. Hopefully, the donation will give people a chance to get the support they need," said Ray.

"So many people turned out for Alan's funeral. We also received messages from all over the world, as he met people while playing games online. It was all so touching."

Men and women alike are welcome to go along to the Barrhead Men's Shed, where they can share tools, gain a sense of achievement and enjoy some social interaction.

## Finding a way to give back to the community

## Worthy causes in Newton Mearns are to get $\pounds1,800$ of funding in the first of several donations to come from a partnership with homebuilders.

Once all the homes in the first phase of the Maidenhill development in the town are bought, CALA Homes and Taylor Wimpey will hand over a total of  $\pounds$ 9,250.

The homebuilders have pledged a £50 donation for each of the 185 homes after forming a partnership with East Renfrewshire Good Causes (ERGC).

Buyers have now moved in at Westfield Gardens and Hazeldene Lea, which means the first tranche of funding can be made.

"This is an especially meaningful partnership as the money is coming from a local development and will go directly into funding projects and causes across East Renfrewshire neighbourhoods," said Russell Macmillan, founder of ERGC.

"We've done a lot of fantastic work in the local community since I started the charity over 12 years



ago. In the last six months alone, for example, our funding has allowed us to deliver a piano to a day care centre for people living with dementia and provide paint and garden materials to a team of volunteers to improve the outdoor and entrance area to Isobel Mair School.

"Thanks to this donation, we'll be able to continue our important outreach."

Angela O'Hara, sales consultant, at CALA Homes (West), said that giving back to the local area is hugely important to the company.

## Major international interest for local author's financial self-help guide...

A self-published Clarkston author has sold the rights of his book to a Seoul publisher.

The personal finance title, that reads as a self-help guide to midlife professionals aged from 35 to 60 who are stuck in a rut and

looking to restart their lives, is to be translated for Korean readers.

David Sawyer, 47, from Clarkston said RESET should be on sale in Korea in the new year.


"When I got the call to say a Korean publishing house wanted to take on my book, I nearly fell off my chair," he said.

"All I could manage to blurt out was, 'north or south?' But when I looked into it, I could see the potential. South Korea has a population of 50 million and people there are committed to self-improvement and getting their finances in order.

"Fingers crossed that the translator does a good job and sales do even better than in the UK and US. I can't wait to see the front cover."

David, a public relations consultant in Glasgow, first published the book in August 2018 after working on it full-time for 10 months. It has gone on to sell 7,600 copies worldwide, against average per-book lifetime-sales for self-published authors of 250, and 3,000 for those who publish traditionally.

Meanwhile, the self-published audiobook version sold nearly 1,000 copies within three months of publication.

## Luxury retirement village to open soon

### Work on a Newton Mearns retirement village is due to start in the new year.

The £60million development, which has been called The Hills at Whitecraigs, will be home to more than 300 elderly residents with 214 one and two-bedroom flats, 38 cottages and an 80-bed care home.

An estimated 365 jobs will be supported over the next 30 years with more than £74million said to be generated to the local economy.

The aim of the project is to encourage healthy



living and wellbeing. The development will feature tidal pools, spa facilities and a

fitness suite. The selfcontained village will be built around a central two-storey club house, with a bar,

cafe and community facilities.



Developer Scotsbridge Holdings is now looking for suitable locations in Scotland for similar developments.

Aimed specifically at over 55s, The Hills at Whitecraigs will promote a more holistic approach to residents' health and wellbeing with its design and landscaping, including a high density of trees and water features, and specific facilities such as a bowling green.

"It will set new standards for luxury living for over 55s with a strong emphasis on health. What we plan to offer our residents is

much more than a traditional retirement facility," said Scotsbridge Director Shazad Bakhsh.

## Eco-friendly school habits

Senior pupils at Duncanrig Secondary School in East Kilbride have become trendsetters in their bid to reduce plastic waste.

They have become the first in South Lanarkshire to design and provide reusable water bottles for pupils.

The aim of the Wan Use is Nae Use project is to encourage classmates to become more environmentally aware.

Teacher Allan Wilkie said: "Some of the pupils came to us to complain about the huge amount of waste generated in the school at lunchtimes and breaktimes.

"They worked out that around 500 plastic bottles of water are



purchased every week at Duncanrig.

"We were taken aback by how quickly the idea gathered momentum – it has been amazing and we are very proud of the way the students have kept it going."

Pupils made posters, lobbied South Lanarkshire Council for more water fountains, delivered assemblies to younger students and enlisted the support of local firm Highlander Recycling, who helped to finance new reusable water bottles.

A competition for new first year pupils resulted in 80 designs being incorporated on to the bottles, which are now being sold in the school.

First year pupils Jenna Bain and Courtney Torrance had their designs selected for the bottles.

"I included the recycling sign and waves, to remind people plastic damages the oceans and sea wildlife," explains Jenna.

## Investment set to boost town centres

#### Town centres throughout the East Renfrewshire area are set to reap the benefits after nearly £1million is being invested.

Councillors recently approved handing out the Scottish Government funding.

The planned list of projects includes spending £300,000 on 'intelligent' lighting for Barrhead's Main Street and surrounding areas.

Council chiefs hope that installing the lights will improve public safety, lead to easier maintenance and bring environmental benefits by reducing energy consumption.

There has been £200,000 allocated towards making access and infrastructure improvements at Capelrig Road and Fairweather Park, in Newton Mearns, as well as to enhance facilities in the park.

A report presented to councillors states the work could raise awareness of the wider Newton Mearns town centre as a shopping and leisure destination.

Funds would go towards groundworks, new paths and benches in preparation for a new play park in



2020/21, designed by the community.

Another £200,000 has been set aside for winter lighting at various locations throughout East Renfrewshire. It would cover "all main shopping centres in an inclusive way, forming a recognisable East Renfrewshire identity."

"To ensure a collaborative approach, an initial 'call for ideas' was issued to key stakeholders within East Renfrewshire Council town and neighbourhood centres to give partners the opportunity to help shape the plans," a report by the council's director of environment Andrew Cahill states.
