Pupils finally got to step through the doors of East Renfrewshire's brand new primary school.

The £15million development in the new community of Maidenhill, in Newton Mearns, welcomed youngsters to two primary one classes and children throughout the rest of the year classes, as well as those attending the new nursery class.

More than 800 homes are to be built in the surrounding area

in the coming years.

Alasdair McDonald, Maidenhill Primary's headteacher, told Connect's sister title, the Barrhead News: "I'm looking forward to working in partnership with our new children, families and staff in months and years ahead.

"We knew some of our residents would relish the chance to get involved."


The aim of Paths For All is to get people in Scotland walking regularly, both in their leisure time and during their working day, to promote better health.

Seeing wishes become reality

A local care home in East Renfrewshire has adapted a unique way to care for its residents - by granting their wishes, no matter how unlikely they may be.

Staff at Whitecraigs Care Home have developed PATH – an initiative which sees patients being provided with personalised care, centred around each of their wellbeing goals.

As part of the drive, the team created a 'Wish Wall' that encourages residents to identify an activity they have on their bucket list.

Percy Mann, who has just celebrated his 102nd birthday, served in the police for over 30 years before retiring in 1977 and, inspired by his fond memories of those times in the force, the

Whitecraigs staff organised for two officers to visit him.

They spent over two hours reminiscing with Percy and brought him a crystal police glass, as well as taking him for a spin in their car – with lights and sirens blaring.

John Andrews, 78, was a member of West of Scotland rugby team in his youth and wanted to go to a match to relive his glory days, so staff surprised him with a special visit to Murrayfield Stadium, where he met Scotland legend Chris Patterson.

Annmarie Porter, manager at the care home, in Thornliebank, said: "It is truly inspiring to see the positive impact that the PATH and Wish Wall schemes have had on our residents. "It is an honour to help our residents achieve their goals, whether those are everyday mobility and wellbeing aims or their bigger dreams.

"We work to the ethos that residents don't live in our workplace, we work in their homes, and it is our aim to ensure that all our residents feel healthy, fulfilled and valued."

Some herbs will soon be coming to the end of their natural harvesting period, so here are some top tips on how to pick them to enjoy for months to come.

#### 1. MINT

If you want fresh mint into the winter months, take some cuttings now. Pick three leafy. non-flowered sprigs that are about 10cm long, sit them in a glass of water in a light position inside, ideally on a windowsill, and they should take root fairly quickly. Cut it regularly and it should bush out.

#### 2. PARSLEY

This common herb is usually grown as an annual, either at the front of vegetable beds or in pots. but it doesn't dry well, so if you want to save your harvest, freeze bunches in a plastic bag, then vou can rub the leaves off the stalks when you remove them, as needed.

#### 3. SAGE

This Christmas favourite - an essential addition to stuffing - also looks fantastic as an ornamental because of the striking texture and tone of its

However, sage is a

Mediterranean plant, so won't appreciate a really wet winter. To be on the safe side, dry your sage leaves now by blanching them - dipping them into boiling water followed by cold - then lay them out on baking trays in a warm area to dry, turning them over from time to time. Once they are totally dry, keep them in airtight screw-top jars.

#### 4. CHIVES

They may have long finished flowering, but if you want the oniony flavour of chives later on in the season, you're best off digging up a small clump from your garden to repot and take indoors.

Cut the foliage down to 2.5-5cm (1-2in) above the top of the roots, then repot in multipurpose compost for windowsill plants, which should soon start growing and will be ready after outdoor plants have died down for the winter.

For a bright, cheerful addition to any family room, turn to dependable, easy-to-grow favourites such as the spider plant. Thriving even in a brightly-lit lounge, the bold stripes of the variegated Chlorophytum will last all year round. Try a hanging basket to display it to best effect.

The peace lily is another go-to houseplant, being beautiful and almost indestructible - it actually thrives on under-watering. With its pure white flowers and deep green leaves, it's a calming presence. It's also one of the best plants for removing air pollution.

#### SHABBY CHIC

Dispense with tradition and opt for 'guests' that will bring personality to your rooms. Coconut shells, coffee tins, brass cans - most houseplants aren't fussy - they'll thrive equally happily in unconventional containers.
