Sun keeps shining for Luca

Young jazz singer Luca Manning's biggest fan is his granny.

Better known to the rest of us as Anita Manning. the Glaswegian antiques expert from TV's Bargain Hunt, she has helped nurture his talent over the years, and even given him tips on performing and dealing with nerves.

"Eating bananas is her top tip for an energy boost," laughs the 20-yearold singer, a former pupil of Hillhead High School.

If you haven't heard of Luca you will soon, the winner

of a Rising Star title at the 2018 Scottish Jazz Awards now has a debut CD, When the Sun Comes Out.

According to Luca, his future always lay in music, though he only discovered jazz relatively recently.

"I was in a pop/rock band playing ukulele and writing sad songs with four chords," he says. "I was in a choir in first year - I had a high voice and had to sing with the sopranos. The school had a fantastic,





dedicated music department and there was always an outlet for music."

By the time Manning was taking piano lessons, he was encouraged by his piano teacher to sing.

Weekly jazz workshops run by the Strathclyde Youth Jazz Orchestra followed, with tutoring by pianist Alan Benzie.

He helped the youngster with auditions and prescribed listening material.

Now midway through the fouryear jazz course at Guildhall School of

Music and Drama in London, Manning has supported Georgie Fame and Ruby Turner.

Fans will be delighted to hear that his debut CD is an accurate reflection of what he does in a gig.

He says: "There is no theme to the album but the songs are connected in a way because there are themes of home, identity and love."

Volunteers in the spotlight

More than 80 years of volunteering is celebrated in a new community exhibition at Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum.

Compassion in Crisis charts the work of Royal Voluntary Service and its volunteers, focusing on the organisation's role from wartime to recent years.

Volunteers were there at pivotal moments in history, including the Lockerbie disaster, and over the years have supported older people locally at lunch clubs and social clubs.



They collected salvage and distributed ration books during the Second World, at all times offering comfort and compassion in crisis.

Originally set up in 1938 as

WVS (Women's Voluntary Services), after the Home Secretary asked Stella, Lady Reading, to form a nationwide organisation to assist local authorities recruit women into the Air Raid Precautions movement and help civilians during and after air raids.

In the early days in Glasgow, women volunteers supported the Home Front to help win the war.

Over the years the charity's work has grown to provide volunteer support in communities across the country.

Running until January 31, Compassion in Crisis chronicles eight decades of Royal Voluntary Service in the city. Go along to see documents, photographs, objects and film from Royal Voluntary Service's Heritage Collection.

Kelvinbridge one of world's coolest places to live

A west end area has been voted alongside Tokyo, Los Angeles, Berlin and Bangkok as one of the world's most exciting neighbourhoods.

The list in Time Out looks at new venues, cost of living and the best cultural experience.

Glasgow's historic Kelvinbridge was placed 37th in the top 50.

From the scenic riverside footpath beneath the Kelvin Bridge to the towering glass panels of the Botanic Gardens, it's no wonder the area captured the eyes - and hearts - of Glaswegians and those behind the list.

The student-friendly hub was also highlighted for all things retro, taking in its vibrant scene of vintage fashion, classic books and well-worn vinyl.

Food and drink also influenced the decision of many, with Time Out recommending riverfront craft beer bar Inn Deep and traditional pub The Doublet.

Indy music station LP Radio was also mentioned for its record shop-turned-studio.

More than 27,000 people across the world marked Kelvinbridge worthy of the list. Other neighbourhoods voted for include Arroios in Lisbon, which managed to grab the top spot, as well as Shimokitazawa in Tokyo, Historic Filipinotown in Los Angeles and Astoria in New York.

A spokeswoman for Glasgow City Council said: "The diversity of our neighbourhoods is increasingly appealing to international visitors who are looking for authentic travel experiences and want to live like a local."

Hillhead pupils study Highers a year early

West End school pupils are in the fast lane when it comes to studying for exams.

Under a radical new curriculum model taken up by Hillhead High School, pupils capable of studying Highers start them a year early, sit them over two years instead of one and bypass National 5s altogether.

According to Karen McAlaney, the school's headteacher, the idea is to reduce the burden of assessment on pupils and create more time for deeper learning, both key founding principles of Curriculum for Excellence (CfE).

She said: "In 2008, Hillhead was a successful school, but stayingon rates and attainment were not as high as they should have been, especially for pupils from the most deprived areas.



"There were concerns about attendance and destinations for some, and we wanted to increase the number and



quality of exam passes and make space for wider achievements. "The strengths of the model are that it reduces duplication of work. Previously, pupils completing some National 5s would repeat pretty similar assessments in S5 for Higher. The time is better spent developing skills and understanding."

Although results at Higher have fluctuated from year to year there has been an overall increase in the number of pupils achieving Highers since 2013, when the model was introduced.

This year, nearly 70 per cent of school leavers secured at least one Higher compared to 48 per cent six years ago.

First Minister given lesson in graffiti art

When visiting a charity art project in the West End recently, Nicola Sturgeon was given a personal lesson in graffiti spraying.

The First Minister added to a series of murals painted by dozens of artists on a stretch of derelict railway arches along the Clydeside Expressway.

The project is Scotland's only legal space for practising graffiti and street art, it was organised by music and arts venue SWG3's charity arm Clydeside Initiative for Arts. Artists from across the world contributed

to the colourful entrance to the Yorkhill area, spending more than 700 hours painting the murals.

Sturgeon wrote on Twitter: "Thanks to everyone at the brilliant SWG3 Yardworks Railway Arch project for the lesson in graffiti art earlier – really good fun."

Gaz Mac, SWG3 studio director, said: "It was very special to have the First Minister here to celebrate the completion of our latest Clydeside Initiative for the Arts project.



"Graffiti and street art is a growing part of Glasgow's culture and it's important that people understand its potential for creating positive change

within communities."

Mutley, the director of SWG3, said, "The pathway along the Clydeside Expressway is one of the gateways to Yorkhill and Finnieston from the river and also connects the city centre to the west end, so it's fantastic to see what was ultimately an unloved facade of arches, brought back to life with these incredible murals. It gives you a sense of what lies behind."

Making the most of small gardens

If your garden is the side of a postage stamp and you just want a feeling of space when you step outside, landscape expert Gena Lorainne and planting designer Carolyn Dunster, author of Urban Flowers, offer tips...

Use mirrors

Placing a mirror or two in your small garden can create an illusion of a bigger space, which could look twice the original size. When positioning a mirror pick the right spot - somewhere where it won't be a visual hazard, as the reflection of the sun can damage not only your eyes but plants as well. For best results, choose a slightly shady area, Lorainne suggests.

If you position a mirror on your boundary it will reflect the space back, so you cannot see where your garden ends, Dunster adds.

Make use of walls and fences

Plant your favourite flowers along walls and fences to add some brightness and to spread their gorgeous scent all around your green space. Hanging flower baskets can also look great, says Lorainne.

Introduce different sized plants

Dunster explains: "A range of different sized plants means you can layer your planting and give it depth, although there is no need to place all your tall plants at the back of a border. Varying the heights makes your planting look more dense. Tall thin wispy plants such as Verbena bonariensis look good



woven in between shorter flowering plants - you can see through them to the plants behind."

Add climbing plants

These will give height to your garden without taking up too much ground space, says Lorainne.

Are you rejoicing because knitwear season is finally here? Us too.

Here are four new trends to try now ...

1. Coordinate your look

Winter's answer to double denim, woolly coords are a genius idea, because they're as comfy as loungewear but still look classy.

For a chic workwear look, team a jumper and skirt set with brown leather boots and accessories, or keep it casual with slouchy trousers and trainers.

2. Dress it up

Loose, Eighties-style jumper dresses take a back seat for autumn as form-fitting knits take centre stage.

In ribbed fabrics and dark hues, these clingy frocks are a far cry from frumpy jumpers. Add knee high boots to really amp up the sex appeal.

3. Play with proportions

Another way to make a snuggly jumper feel modern is by opting for an on-trend silhouette and this season that means balloon sleeves.

A chunky jumper with puffy sleeves is ideal for teaming with an A-line mini or a floaty maxi dress and a pair of ankle boots.

4. Embrace your animal side

Leopard print may have dominated all summer, but now zebra stripes are ruling the fashion kingdom.

Help wildlife prepare to hibernate

As the cool nights arrive, animals are getting ready to hibernate - and there's plenty gardeners can do to make it easier for them.

So, which animals can we help and how?

Hedgehogs

If you have a compost heap, you're already half way there for helping hedgehogs, because these hibernating mammals love them. So make sure you do any compost-turning slowly



and carefully during the winter months so you don't disturb your prickly friends, advises Helen Bostock, RHS senior horticultural adviser and co-author of How Can I Help Hedgehogs? Also, don't block off the crawl spaces under garden sheds and decking, because hedgehogs also hibernate happily under there.

Frogs

To help these amphibians, make a hiding place by digging a hole in the ground, around 10cm deep, lining it with gravel, twigs and dry leaves. Then put a large flat stone over the top, such as a piece of paving slab, leaving them enough space to crawl in.

If you have a pond which is well oxygenated, some frogs may overwinter in the bottom of it, burying themselves in the silt layer and breathing through their skin. Stop the pond from icing over by placing a tennis ball on the surface, which will help oxygenation.

Bees

For the buff-tailed bumblebee (Bombus terrestris) and honeybees, winter can be just as busy a time as the rest of the year. In the warmer parts of the UK, fully active winter colonies of this species are regularly recorded.

Help them survive by choosing a sunny spot for plants which carry nectar-rich flowers through the shortest days of the year, such as Mahonia x media, stinking hellebore and winter-flowering heathers.
